Dr. Benjamin Radd received his Phd in Political Science from UCLA , where he currently teaches public law and political science, and a JD from Stanford Law School. Dr. Radd specializes in government and politics of the Middle East, comparative law, and constitutionalism. He completed his dissertation on the development of Iranian constitutionalism in 2015.

Rabbi Dalia Samansky was ordained by Hebrew Union College in 2009, and has served on the faculty of the Florence Melton School of Adult Jewish Learning for five years. In that time, she has taught courses on Torah, Basic Jewish theology, General Jewish history, American Jewish history, and denominationalism. In addition to teaching and officiating at family ceremonies, Rabbi Samansky focuses on pastoral work; guiding hospice patients and their families through the final stage of life.
